The second semester of social studies is the study of the Pacific Islands. Unlike the other core classes, in which a year grade determines passing or failing, your child must pass each individual semester course, in order to successfully move to the 8th grade.

In this semester, students will learn about the geography of the Pacific rim, demographic patterns, current issues and problems that face Pacific Island nations, and interactions between the U.S. and Pacific Islands.

Assessments

Formative Assessments: These assignments/projects/quizzes/classwork/homework are used to prepare students for the Summative Assessments. The purpose of the formative assessments is to check students' understanding of the benchmarks' concepts, skills, and content. Formatives are scored on a proficient/not proficient scale. Students' receiving not proficient scores should make corrections or seek assistance to make sure they understand the assessment. While formative assessments will not be used to determine final grades, they are important in the understanding of the benchmark.

Summative Assessments: Summative assessments are the student's opportunity to show their understanding of the benchmark's concepts, skills, and content. Using the analogy of athletics, formative assessments are like practices, summative assessments are like playing the game. Summative assessments will be scored on an Advanced, Proficient, Partially Proficient, or Novice scale. For each benchmark there is a school summative that will be taken in class. In addition, for most benchmarks a take home summative assessment (research writing, project, thinking map, etc...) may be assigned. Students are allowed to use any previous formatives to complete their take home summatives.

Grading: Grades will be determined based on students' performance on their summative assessments. Grades will be based on how well students have demonstrated their knowledge of the concepts, skills, and content of each particular benchmark. Rubrics are included with every summative.

All Advanced scores on summatives = A+
Majority Advanced/the rest Proficient = ASome Advanced/majority proficient – B
All Proficient = C
Some Proficient/Some Partially Proficient = CMajority Partially Proficient = D
Majority Novice = F

Late Work: Formative assessments will be accepted late, however, students may not get timely feedback on these late assignments. Students' planner will be stamped with "Incomplete/Missing Assignment". Please follow up with your child on any missing or incomplete homework. (Note: If work is required to be completed on computer (ex. Writing assignment) and home printer could not be used, students may send the assignment via email to your SS teacher. Use the address on the top of this sheet. Microsoft Word is the preferred word processing software, other programs may not print at school. Take home summatives are generally not accepted late.

Social Studies Portfolio

Students will keep in class a portfolio of the current term's work. This portfolio will be shared with parents/guardians during the following intercession. This will be kept in a 1 inch 3-ringed binder and shared with parents/guardians at the end of the term.
