<b>Background Information</b>	<b>1st to Unite all major Islands</b>	<b>abolishes Kapu</b>	<b>age 10 when he becomes King, "rules" for 29 years</b>	<b>He and his wife Emma created Queen's hospital.</b>	<b>Last of the royal monarchy related to Kamehemeha.</b>
<b>Political</b>	<b>Kapu System - laws of the traditional Hawaiians, Kamehameha I has absolute power.</b>	<b>Abolishes Kapu system, disorder in kingdom results, Missionaries arrive</b>	<b>Creates 2 constitutions: Constitution of 1840 &amp; 1852 - Limits the power of the king.</b>		<b>Abolishes Constitution of 1852 and creates Constitution of 1864 - restores many of the powers back to the king</b>
<b>Social</b>	<b>Kapu System - set down what people could and could not do. Capt. Cook arrives, brings new things - including weapons and diseases. Estimated 300,000 Native Hi population</b>	<b>Missionaries bring Christianity. Since Kapu system is gone, women gain more rights. Diseases - kill thousands of native Hawaiians</b>	<b>Mahele - most commoner Hawaiians lose lands. Disease continues to kill Hawaiian Population. Foreign workers brought in to work on plantations.</b>

<b>Lunalilo</b>	<b>Kalakaua</b>	<b>Lili'uokalani</b>
<b>beats Kalakaua in election, reigns for only 1 year</b>	<b>Dies in San Francisco....heir to throne - Lili'uokalani</b>	<b>Last monarch to rule Hawaii.</b>
<b>First elected king not coming from the Kamehameha bloodline.</b>	<b>Forced to sign Bayonet Constitution of 1887. Loss of monarchy power. Hawaiian League, Committee of Safety, Annexationist groups form.</b>	<b>Led by Sugar Plantation leaders, Hawaiian Kingdom overthrown, Political and Economic reasons.</b>
<b>Diseases continue to devastate Native population - estimate that only 35,000 - 40,000 alive.</b>	<b>Brings back Hawaiian culture - language, music, chants, and Hula.</b>	<b>Composes Hawaiian music, continues to use Hawaiian language...</b>
